- Meeting the demands of Arkansas Healthcare


Interventions

 - 2 Years MSN (FNP, CNS)


 May Graduation

Results

 3 fold increase in DNP class significant increase in FNP/ CNS applicants



 100% employment rates at all level of nursing



 FNP Pass Rate well above national average for past 3 years

Conclusions

(2 +2) Academic Achievement Program appears to be very effective in its early stages.
