



- Preventative health.


BENEFITS OF INTEGRATIVE HEALTH CENTER

Cost Savings

- Trek saved over \$200,000 average net annual savings in cost of care for services provided on-site
- Health Insurance premiums have not increased in price in 4 years
- Less employee time missed

Health of Employees

- Improved chronic disease management
- Timely management of acute issues
- Ability to follow patients closely
- Early intervention for health risks
- Access to integrative care



2017 Survey of U.S. Medical Workplace Clinics:

- 33% of companies with 5,000+ employees had a work place clinic
- 16% of companies with 500-4,999 employees had a work place clinic
- 68% of these staffed by a Nurse Practitioner
- 18% offered mental health services

BENEFITS OF WORK PLACE CLINICS IN THE LITERATURE

Cost Savings:

- Work place visits 42% the cost of community visits (Turner, 2010)
- Saving \$1.00 for every \$0.15 spent in workplace clinic (Turner, 2010)
- Saving \$6.69 for every \$1.00 spent on care in the workplace clinic (Fox & McCorkle, 2018)
- Saving \$2.23 in saved sick time per \$1.00
 spent on care in workplace clinic (Baicker, Cutler & Song, 2010)

Time Savings:


 Average of approx. 3 more productive on the job hours for workplace visits

Employee Satisfaction:

- 95% of employees would recommend their workplace clinic to coworkers
