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Did you know?

- When PA nurses were organizing in 1903, they were viewed by some as organizing a union.
- Invited NY nurses to inform them of the difficulties they ran into when pushing for registration.
- Had opposition coming from many sides
- Used the press to help with supportive editorials

Why Include History in Policy Preparation

- Understand what has preceded the current issue:
 - Why are things like they are today?
- Consider issues that arose in the past
 - Look at secondary sources for analysis of issues that arose in the past

How to Discover Precedents in Nursing History Through Databases

- CINAHL

How to Search for Primary Resources

- Archives
- Google books
- Historical Newspapers
- Historical Films

Corroboration and Perspectives

- Place the primary sources within their historical times through reading
- Ask questions while reading: Do not accept just one perspective
- Look for the historical source's or historical figure's "agenda"

Scrutinize Historical Data for Bias, Accuracy and Plausibility

- Bias may be present in primary sources
- Investigate the background of the sources
- Several sources will increase veracity of the story
- Increase plausibility by widely reading on the topic
