Health Policy and the DNP

- DNP Essential V: Health Care Policy for Advocacy in Health Care
 - Governmental actions
 - Institutional decision making
 - Organization standards
- "...creating a health care system that meets the needs of its constituents" (AACN, 2006, p. 14)
- Design, influence, and implement health care policies that frame health care financing, practice regulation, access, safety, quality, and efficacy (IOM, 2001)

Real Life Importance

- Regardless of our role, we are impacted by Health Policy...
 - BSN in 10 (Nurse Educators)
 - Affordable Care Act (all healthcare workers)
 - Opioid Management
 - Staffing Ratio Bills (Nurse Leaders)
 - Access to Care (Practice Authority)(Nurse Practitioners)

The Role of Policy in the DNP Project: Which comes first?

- Policy may guide the project
- Practice and evidence may guide policy
- Policy should be guided by the evidence-based research and DNP Project
 - Background and Significance
 - Needs Assessment
 - Implications

Policy Intervention


Expert testimony; content experts; gain legislative support



Legislation Evaluation Identification of successes/obstacles to legislation; how to measure outcomes; sustainability




Work with a Community-based Action Group

Challenges of Policy Focused Projects

- "Non-traditional" projects
 - Faculty comfort level
 - Implementation strategies
 - Policy change may be hypothetical v true implementation
 - Students may not be in position of authority to execute policy change
 - Evaluation process may not include traditional statistical analysis
 - Variation in approach to evaluation
 - Evaluation of advocacy v actual impact of policy change
 - Level of policy

Policy Solutions

- Start with analysis of the problem that impacts the patient/population
- Investigate from a lens of:
 - Organizational Policy
 - Local/Community Policy
 - State Policy
 - National Policy
 - Professional Policy
 - Personal Policy (ethics)
- Catalog a list of advocacy activities
- Measure outcomes of advocacy activity
- Determine evaluation points for the DNP Project
- Incorporate use of social media to advance the agenda
